



Seb Prohn is the senior research and evaluation specialist at VCU's Partnership for People with Disabilities. His work addresses improved quality of life, health, and community participation across the lifespan. He is the lead analyst of Virginia's National Core Indicators In-Person Survey, an instrument used to monitor the impact of HCBS waiver supports on personal outcomes and opportunities for people with IDD. Today, he'll use NCI data to share some information about employment in Virginia.



Machine Learning


A form of artificial intelligence in which a large dataset trains an algorithm to explore all possible predictors of specific outcome.



Predicting Community Employment

- "Is community employment a goal in person's service plan?" YES
- 30% more important than any other predictor
- Other top predictors include
 - Volunteerism
 - Choice- schedule, buy, day program
 - Employment training
 - Voting







At the bottom of your screen, click "Breakout Rooms":



Question & Answer



Where exactly do I go to apply for Pre-ETS? Do I work with my school? If I want to apply for services?

Go to the DARS website and click on the "How Do I Apply?" under the header "What is VR?"
 That will give you the contact information for your local DARS field office.

Can you explain how to get pre-ETS services started, both for students enrolled in public schools and those not attending public school?

 You want to start with your school! Please contact your school's transition coordinator who should be able to assist you, and you can always contact DARS.

Remember: Supported Employment is for people who need the help of a job coach. The job coach is the key part of the supported employment experience.

Question & Answer



Can homeschooled students obtain Pre-ETS?

Homeschooled students can reach out to their local DARS field office for assistance.

My adult child is already out of school. What do you mean, other service providers who can request Pre-ETS? Can a doctor request?

 Just a reminder: Pre-ETS is available to students 14 to 22 years old, but please connect with your local DARS field office to find out how to obtain services for an adult. They can point you in the right direction.

Does DARS provide services for 28-year-olds that move to Virginia from another state?

 A person has to "have presence" in Virginia in order to receive services. Ask your local DARS field office!

Question & Answer



How does one learn more about and apply for paid/unpaid summer internships?

When you connect with a counselor, you will learn about internships and other opportunities.
 The first step is to call!

Are there any autism-specific services available at DARS?

 Yes, there are autism-specific services. Go to the DARS website. The most important thing is to connect with the local field office to get services.

Are all DARS services free of charge, or fee-based? Please talk about eligibility.

 There are not costs for Pre-ETS. There may be certain costs for VR services. If you receive SSI, fees may be waived. Please contact your local field office!
