- Constipation & the Importance of Bowel Monitoring- A notable percentage of deaths are a result of GI/bowel obstructions. Knowing the signs, symptoms and risk factors for constipation could help to prevent it.
- Dental Facts & Tips from the OIH Dental Team Periodontal disease, an infection of the gums, is a result of different factors such as oral hygiene and certain medications. Individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities are at a greater risk for periodontal disease. The OIH Dental team offers prevention tips and a list of symptoms.

- Ed Department Offers More Special Education Guidance Amid COVID-19- A webinar and fact sheet from the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights provides guidance to education leaders on how to care for the needs of students with developmental disabilities.
- Social Security Closes Offices Nationwide- The Social Security Administration is closing its local offices due to coronavirus but assistance is still available via telephone. Payments to beneficiaries (those that are elderly or have serious disabilities that prevent self-supporting work) will continue as usual.
- For Kids with Autism, School Shutdown Poses Even Bigger Quandary- The story of twin brothers, Nick and Noah, captures the real challenges parents face now that schools are out of session.
- New Group to Help Crime Victims with Disabilities- An Ohio based nonprofit organization is helping to ensure those with developmental disabilities have a voice if they are victims of crime.

- SSI Recipients May Receive Economic Impact Payments- Individuals collecting Supplemental Security Income (SSI) may be eligible to receive a \$1,200 Economic Impact Payment.
- Question: "Should S/He File for Unemployment?"- In order to address the
 questions surrounding unemployment and COVID-19, a webinar has been
 created to give answers and guidance on how benefits can be affected by
 Unemployment Insurance.
- **Supported Decision Making = Alternatives to Guardianship-** Supported Decision Making (SDM) allows people with disabilities to keep their decision-making capacity by choosing supporters to help them make choices. In a 3-part webinar, learn some alternatives to seeking legal guardianship of your child.
- **Special Education During the COVID-19 Crisis-** A 3-minute webinar series provides information on various topics.
