Recent news reports indicate a Hepatitis A outbreak in southwest Virginia. Information on Hepatitis A from the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) (2020, July).

Key facts

- An effective vaccine is available.
- Outbreaks still occur in the United States; currently there are widespread person-to-person outbreaks.
- Recent foodborne outbreaks in the U.S. traced to imported food.
- Common in many countries, especially those without modern sanitation.

How long does it last?

Hepatitis A can last from a few weeks to several months.

How is it spread?

 Hepatitis A is spread when a person ingests fecal matter – even in microscopic amounts – from contact with objects, food, or drinks contaminated by feces or stool from an infected person.

How serious is it?

- People can be sick for a few weeks to a few months.
- Most recover with no lasting liver damage.
- Although very rare, death can occur.
