ABA Snippets ...

Dignity

The BACB code of ethics and the Virginia Positive Behavior Support (VPBS) code of ethics both include dignity as a core principle/value. Dignity can be hard to define. Nobel laureate Bob Dylan's song, "Dignity" follows a narrator searching for dignity (4). Dylan neither defines nor shares how to find dignity. Luckily the ethics codes do, globally with core principles, as well as in specific standards (1)(7). Both codes require obtaining informed consent and assent prior to providing services and outline commitments to dignity and respect. Individual self-determination and the dignity of risk are key concepts that practitioners must be aware of with service delivery (6).

Consent is permission. It is important to know who is required to give consent. It may be the individual receiving services, or someone responsible for the individual.

When a person receiving services is unable to give consent then their assent is required, meaning somehow, they indicate "willingness to participate" (1). This may be more complicated if "resistance to routines and tasks is the precise reason for service." (2). When this is the case, clinical or company policy and mentorship may offer additional ethical guidance.

Informed almost always precedes consent throughout the aforementioned ethics codes, because consenting alone does not fulfill the ethical obligation. The consenting person must have knowledge of the treatment. Knowledge of treatment includes understanding "(a) all important aspects of the planned treatment, (b) all potential risks and benefits of the planned procedure or research protocols, (c) all potential evidence-based alternative treatments, and (d) the right to discontinue treatment at any time" (3).

When providing behavior services, a practitioner must value informed consent and assent. It is not always easy, but it is always important. If Mr. Dylan were a behaviorist, the final verse of "Dignity" may have been:

I found someone while searching the nation.

Obsessing dignity became my obligation.

Consent and assent creating a framed relation.

Explaining how to reinforce functional communication,

Providing dignity
